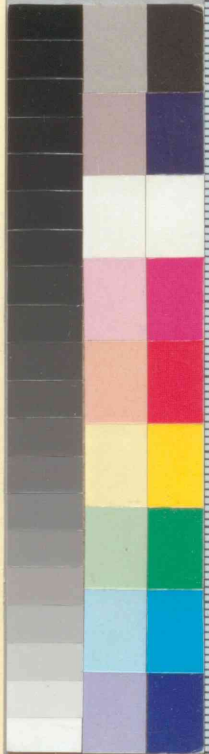

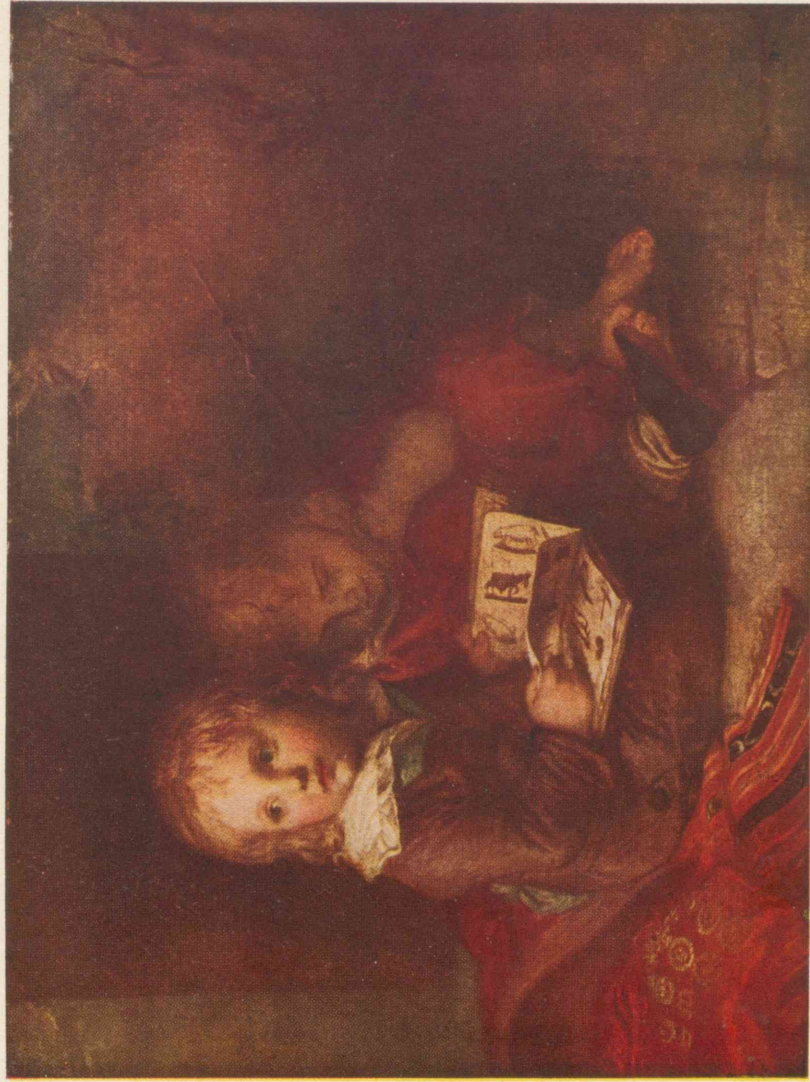

## 緒 言

(A) 本書を使用せらるゝ教師諸賢へ

本書五卷は我が國の女子の中等學校の英語の教科書として編纂したものであります。英語が毎週三時間、五箇年間に亘りて課せらるゝものとして、如何なる教科書が適當でありませうか。云ふまでもなく我が國女子中等學校の英語教育の目的は一方に於ては簡易普通なる英語を読む力、聽く力、話す力、綴る力を養ひ、一方に於てはかゝる力を養ふ間に外國の國民性に接觸せしめて、我が國民性の豊饒化を助くるにあると信じます。此の目的を教育上並に學習上より見て最も經濟的に達成するために本書に於ては左の諸點に留意したのであります。

一 最も簡易普通なる英語を採擇してあります。大體に於て男子中等學校の第四學年程度にとめてあります。

二 發音は私共外國人にとりては最も順序正しく練習することが肝要であると信じます。それ故に發音練習の基礎となる第一卷に於ては、第一に子音母音の練習の順序に、第二には語の發音に、第三には文の讀方に細密な注意を拂つてあります。

三 思想發表の形式も私共外國人にとりては順序正しき練習を要します。それ故に特に第一卷及び第二卷に於て此點について深甚の注意を拂つてあります。

四 第四卷及び第五卷に於ては文法上の知識を纏めてあります。女子の中等學校に於ては時間が少いから、かうする方が英語の力を確實にする上に最も妥當な方法と信じたからであります。

五 英語の唱歌は曲が生徒の程度相當の名高いものであり、歌も亦簡明であつて有名なものを選び、生徒が在學中のみならず他日家庭に於ても愛唱し得るやう工夫してあります。

六 五卷を通じて材料は趣味豊かなるもの、意味深きものを選んであります。

七 各卷に對話を相當に加へてあります。これを善用することが英語の力を増進する上に有力であることを信ずるからであります。

八 諸外國の國民性を表はす材料は注意して選んであるのみならず、外國人が眺めた我が國民性に關する材料も加へてあります。

九 第三卷以上に於て、各課に生徒の豫習又は復習に重要であると考へられる注意を加へてあります。教師が謄寫刷などで與へたいと思ふやうなものを相當に加へたつもりであります。又附録には復習上重要と考へるものを選んであります。これ等は多年の經驗上からの試みであります。

(B) 本書によつて英語を學習する生徒諸子へ

本書によつて英語の力を養ひ、自分の性格を練成せんと欲するならば、是非とも次にあげる注意を守らねばなりません。

一 發音は先生の模範に倣つて反復練習するより外に良法がありません。第一卷及第二卷に於て特に發音並に讀方を反復練習する工夫をこらしてありますが、先生の發音や範讀を模倣して理解しつゝ何回となく反復練習することが最も大切であります。

二 英語は直讀直解することを工夫せねばなりません。英語を直に其の意味を理會するやうに、工夫することが肝要であるのみならず、英文を何度も讀み下して其の意味を直解する工夫を絶えず致さねばなりません。讀書百遍意自ら通ずる工夫は語學修養上の金言であることを忘れてはなりません。

三 實物を見ては直接に英語で云つて見る。また種々の心持を直接に英語で表はして見る工夫は英語の實力を發達せしむる上に重要であります。また自ら文章を音讀するのみならず、他人の讀むのを聽いて理解することも英語の語感を養ひ英語の實力養成上重要であることを忘れてはなりません。

四 本書によつて英語の力を養はんとするならば、本書に精通することを要します。出来るならば暗誦を企てるがよいのであります。

五 各卷の附録は既習の部分に常に反復練習するを要するものであります。

六 各課の注意は主として復習に利用すべきものであります。豫習にも利用することが大切であります。

七 本書によつて人格を練成せんと欲するならば、各文を熟讀玩味するを要します。到る所に人間の生命の深い叫びが見出されることを信じて疑ひません。
