Geometric proof of the Pythagorean theorem. A square with side length  $a+b$  is divided into four right-angled triangles with legs  $a$  and  $b$ , and hypotenuse  $c$ . The area of the square is  $(a+b)^2 = a^2 + 2ab + b^2$ . The area of the four triangles is  $4 \times \frac{1}{2}ab = 2ab$ . The area of the square formed by the hypotenuses is  $c^2$ . Equating the two expressions for the total area gives  $a^2 + 2ab + b^2 = 2ab + c^2$ , which simplifies to  $a^2 + b^2 = c^2$ .
